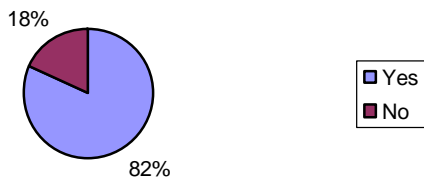

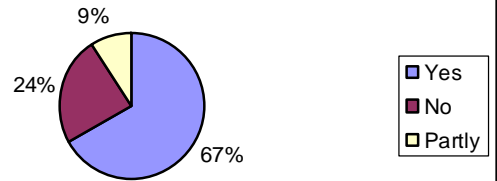
How many times have you attended a SNH Meeting?



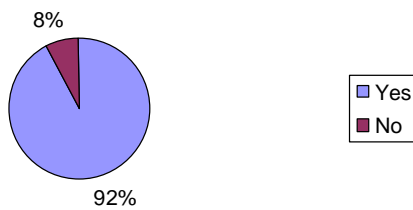
Have you ever raised an issue at a SNH Meeting?



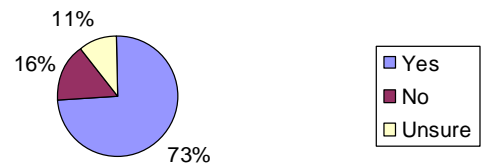

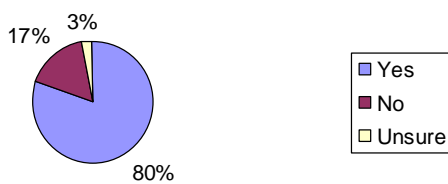

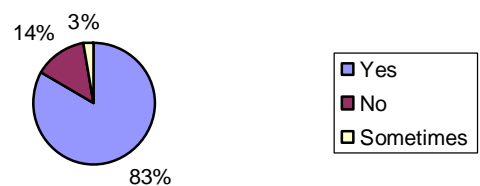
Do you think the Meetings help to reduce the fear of crime?

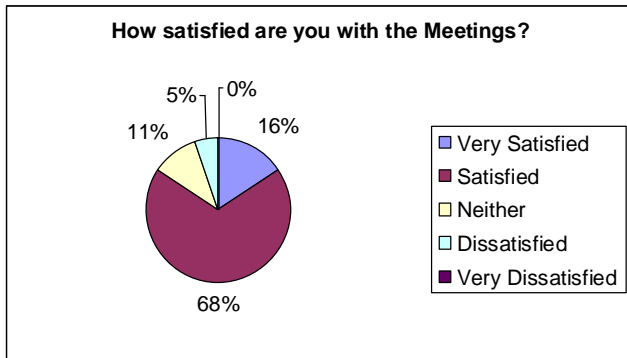


Do the SNH Meetings improve confidence in the Police & Council?

Any other comments?

- Concentrate on one problem at a time
- Police time should be deployed onto the streets
- Action needed is strong, no-nonsense Police action
- Inviting younger element – i.e. 18+, church groups, scout leaders etc
- Names of Chairman, Council Officers, Police etc to be displayed
- Make sure all areas of the group are covered & not concentrated on one place
- Encourage a two-way dialogue between Police & public - not just Police and Councillors
- Police must give confidence to public
- Keep presentation concise and do not allow a presentation to be too long
- Feedback from workshops & comments at meetings as to how grassroots contribution has been taken into account at 'action' and 'strategic' level
- Chairman to be more affirmative on keeping speeches relevant to agenda items
- Residents need to see action being taken to improve the area in which we live.
- People who wish to bring up an issue - let you know in advance of their question so it can be dealt with immediately instead of waiting until the next meeting.
- Setting up free self-defence courses.
